## TEN DISTRICTS SELECTED.

A Presiding Chairman and a Subcommittee in Each District—Meet ings to be Held. Simultaneously in Each Church Appointed.

In each of the districts, meetings will be carried on simultaneously throughout the weeks of the campaign. The general method is new to Toronto, as importance is not laid on one central point, but on numerous places. Provision will be made for holding daily services for workers in factories, shops and stores. Special services for children will also be held and meetings in hotels are being arranged. arranged.

Will be Many Workers,

Mr. E. G. Chapman, general organizer of the campaign, is expected to visit the city on Saturday to meet the General Committee and make final arrangements for the appointment of the evangelists to the various districts. There will be between thirty and thirty-five workers, accompanying the leaders, Enapman and Alexander, Rev. J. H.
