REMARKS BY THE HONOURABLE JOHN ROBARTS PRIME MINISTER OF ONTARIO AT ONTARIO PLACE COUNTDOWN RECEPTION AND TOUR TORONTO, TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 3RD, 1970

IT IS WITH A CONSIDERABLE DEGREE OF PERSONAL EXCITEMENT THAT I WELCOME YOU TO THIS SPECIAL PREVIEW TO MARK THE BEGINNING OF OUR FINAL SIX MONTH COUNTDOWN IN THE PREPARATION OF ONTARIO PLACE.

AS YOU CAN READILY SEE, WE HAVE ALREADY COME A LONG WAY IN THE CREATION OF OUR NEW PROVINCIAL SHOWCASE. AS WE MOVE INTO THE FINAL SIX MONTHS PRIOR TO COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT, IT IS A GREAT PLEASURE TO HAVE THIS OPPORTUNITY TO EXPRESS OUR THANKS TO THE MANY OF YOU HERE TONIGHT WHO IN SUCH GREAT MEASURE, HAVE WORKED SO HARD TO MAKE ONTARIO PLACE A REALITY. AT THIS POINT IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF ONTARIO PLACE WE WANTED TO GIVE THOSE, WHO HAVE SHOWN SUCH AN INTEREST IN THIS PROJECT, AN OPPORTUNITY TO LET THEIR FAMILIES AND FRIENDS EXAMINE AT FIRST HAND THE FULL SCOPE AND EXCITEMENT OF THIS IMPORTANT NEW SHOWCASE FOR OUR PROVINCE AND PEOPLE.

When we first began some years ago

TO CONSIDER THE CONCEPT OF A MAJOR NEW PROVINCIAL

DEVELOPMENT ADJACENT TO THE C.N.E. IT BECAME APPARENT

THAT TO FULFILL ITS OBLIGATIONS THIS COMPLEX, IN

WHATEVER FORM IT MIGHT ULTIMATELY DEVELOP, WOULD HAVE

TO REFLECT A WIDE VARIETY OF REQUIREMENTS. WE FELT

THERE WAS A NEED IN ONTARIO FOR SOMETHING AKIN TO A

SPIRITUAL HOME, A TOUCHSTONE OF STABILITY, A PLACE

WHERE PEOPLE COULD COME, SEE AND REFLECT UPON THE

SOCIETY THAT HAS BEEN CREATED IN ONTARIO. WE FELT

THERE WAS A NEED FOR A PLACE WHERE WE COULD EXAMINE

OUR HISTORY, LOOK AT OUR CULTURAL AND ECONOMIC

GROWTH AND CONTEMPLATE THE CHALLENGES OF THE FUTURE.

IN SHORT, WE WANTED A PLACE TO RE-AFFIRM OUR IDENTITY

AS ONTARIANS AND CANADIANS.

WITH ALL OF THIS IN MIND, IT WAS

DETERMINED THAT A PROVINCIAL SHOWCASE SHOULD BE NOT

ONLY A PLACE TO REFLECT, BUT A PLACE WHICH REFLECTS

US THE WAY WE ARE. IT SHOULD BE AN EXCITING PLACE,

JUST AS ONTARIO IS AN EXCITING AND DYNAMIC PROVINCE.

A PLACE BRIMMING WITH ACTIVITY AND VITALITY. IT

SHOULD BE COSMOPOLITAN TO MATCH THE COSMOPOLITAN

PERSONALITY OF THE PEOPLE OF ONTARIO.

IN THE SUMMER OF 1968, THE GOVERNMENT OF ONTARIO MADE A COMMITMENT TO HELP COMPLEMENT THE CANADIAN NATIONAL EXHIBITION, THAT LARGEST OF ALL ANNUAL EXHIBITIONS THAT HAS PLAYED SUCH AN IMPORTANT PART IN THE LIVES OF CANADIANS FOR MORE THAN NINETY YEARS. THAT, PLUS A DETAILED STUDY OF POPULATION DISTRIBUTION AND TRANSPORTATION NETWORKS, HELPED US REACH THE DECISION TO BUILD ONTARIO PLACE HERE.

THERE WAS ANOTHER FACTOR THAT ULTIMATELY INFLUENCED DETERMINATION OF THE PRECISE FINAL LOCATION. RARELY WHEN DEVELOPING A PROJECT OF THIS MAGNITUDE, ARE WE PROVIDED WITH THE CHANCE TO BEGIN VIRTUALLY WITH A CLEAN SHEET OF PAPER. IN THIS INSTANCE, WE DID. FOR THIS REASON IT SEEMED NOT ONLY WISE BUT ESSENTIAL TO SEIZE THE OPPORTUNITY TO DEMONSTRATE WHAT CAN BE DONE WHEN THOUGHTFUL PLANNING AND A CONCERN FOR THE QUALITY OF LIFE ARE APPLIED TO LAKEFRONT DEVELOPMENT IN ONE OF OUR CONTINENT'S LARGEST CITIES. THIS IS WHY WATER ORIENTATION, AS YOU HAVE SEEN TODAY, IS SUCH AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE TOTAL ONTARIO PLACE COMPLEX.

SINCE THE FIRST TRUCKLOAD OF FILL ROLLED ONTO THE SITE IN MARCH OF 1969, JUST A FEW DAYS AFTER THE PROJECT WAS ANNOUNCED, A GREAT DEAL HAS HAPPENED. THAT IS ABUNDANTLY OBVIOUS. I AM SURE YOU WILL AGREE THAT TO HAVE COME THIS FAR IN JUST NINETEEN MONTHS IS, IN ITSELF, AN ENORMOUS ACHIEVEMENT.

IN LARGE MEASURE, ONTARIO PLACE HAS ALREADY LIVED UP TO ITS NAME. IT HAS AT THIS MOMENT ELEMENTS FROM OUR VAST PROVINCE INCORPORATED THROUGHOUT ITS MORE THAN NINETY ACRES. THIS DARING AND IMAGINATIVE STRUCTURE IS THE PRODUCT OF AN UNTARIO ARCHITECTURAL FIRM, THE STEEL TO BUILD THIS PAVILION WAS CREATED FROM ONTARIO'S MINERAL RESOURCES IN ONTARIO BLAST FURNACES. THE MORE THAN TWO MILLION CUBIC YARDS OF FILL WHICH MAKE UP THESE FOUR ISLANDS OF ALMOST FORTY ACRES WERE HAULED HERE FROM BOOMING CONSTRUCTION SITES AROUND METROPOLITAN TORONTO. THE MATERIALS AND PROCESSES REQUIRED TO FORM THE UNUSUAL TRIODETIC DOME OF CINESPHERE CAME FROM EASTERN ONTARIO. Many of the trees are from Department of Lands and Forest AREAS NEAR BARRIE. AND IN CREATING MOTION PICTURES TO APPEAR AT ONTARIO PLACE, OUR FILM PEOPLE HAVE EMPLOYED THEIR CAMERAS IN COMMUNITIES THROUGHOUT ONTARIO.

BUT THE PROVINCE-WIDE INVOLVEMENT IS ONLY THE BEGINNING. WHEN ONTARIO PLACE OPENS TO THE PUBLIC ON MAY 22ND OF NEXT YEAR, A LITTLE MORE THAN SIX MONTHS FROM NOW, IT WILL TRULY BE A PLACE OF INVOLVEMENT AND ENJOYMENT FOR ALL THE PEOPLE OF THE MORE THAN 200 HOSTS AND HOSTESSES ONTARIO. WHO WILL GREET YOU WILL BE YOUNG PEOPLE FROM ALL PARTS OF OUR PROVINCE. OUR RECRUITMENT OFFICERS ARE CURRENTLY CONDUCTING INTERVIEWS THROUGHOUT ONTARIO. THE SUCCESSFUL CANDIDATES WILL BE THE KIND OF HOSTS AND HOSTESSES WHO WILL MAKE YOU PROUD OF OUR UPCOMING IN ADDITION TO THOSE WORKING AS HOSTS GENERATION. AND HOSTESSES, WE EXPECT THAT AN ADDITIONAL 800 STUDENTS WILL BE EMPLOYED IN OTHER CAPACITIES, JOINING THE APPROXIMATELY 11,000 STUDENTS EMPLOYED EVERY YEAR BY THE PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT IN PROJECTS FROM ONE END OF THE PROVINCE TO THE OTHER,

THE EXHIBITION TO BE HOUSED IN FOUR OF THESE FIVE PAVILION MODULES WILL DESCRIBE ONTARIO'S PAST, PRESENT AND FUTURE.

IT IS BEING CREATED OUT OF OUR PROVINCE'S OFTEN COLORFUL AND EXCITING HISTORY BY SOME OF OUR MOST GIFTED YOUNG RESEARCHERS, WRITERS, DESIGNERS AND FILM MAKERS. AS YOU KNOW, HAVING PARTICIPATED IN TWO WORLD EXPOSITIONS AT MONTREAL AND OSAKA WITH OUTSTANDING SUCCESS, ONTARIO IS NO STRANGER TO MAJOR EXHIBITIONS. WE LOOK FORWARD TO WORLD SCALE QUALITY IN THE EXHIBITION AT ONTARIO PLACE.

ONTARIO PLACE WILL BE A FIVE-PART

EXHIBITION. VISITORS WILL FIRST COME TO AN IMMENSE

ELECTRONIC "WELCOME WALL" WHICH WILL PROVIDE CONSTANTLY
CHANGING INFORMATION ABOUT ACTIVITIES THROUGHOUT ONTARIO

PLACE. THEN WILL FOLLOW AN AREA ENTITLED "GENESIS"

WHICH, AS ITS NAME IMPLIES, WILL DEAL WITH THE VERY

BEGINNING OF WHAT IS NOW ONTARIO. OUR DESIGNERS TELL

ME -- AND AT THIS STAGE I MUST TAKE THEIR WORD FOR IT -
THAT THIS AREA, USING SOME OF THE MOST ADVANCED CINEMATOGRAPHY

TECHNIQUES AVAILABLE SHOULD MAKE VISITORS FEEL AS IF


THEY WERE PRESENT AT THE CREATION.

FOLLOWING "GENESIS" WILL BE AN EXHIBIT
ENTITLED "EXPLOSIONS", IN WHICH VISITORS WILL BE COMPLETELY
SURROUNDED BY IMAGES AND SOUNDS RECREATING THE EXPLOSIVE
ECONOMIC GROWTH OF ONTARIO FROM THE DAYS OF PRIMITIVE
AGRICULTURE AND FUR TRADING TO THE INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL GIANT OF TODAY.

THE NEXT AREA IS TO BE DEVOTED TO THE CULTURE AND CHARACTER OF ONTARIO. THIS EXHIBIT, CALLED "ONTARIO STYLE", WILL LEAD VISITORS THROUGH THE HISTORY OF THIS PROVINCE AND ITS PEOPLE, FROM THE CULTURAL DIGNITY OF THE EARLY INDIAN SOCIETY, THROUGH THE EPIC STRUGGLE FOR CONTROL OF THIS VAST CONTINENT INVOLVING BRITAIN AND FRANCE, INTO OUR OWN STRUGGLE FOR SURVIVAL IN THE WAR OF 1812, AND THROUGH THE NINETEENTH CENTURY. AS "ONTARIO STYLE" CONCLUDES ITS STORY WITH THE EVENTS OF THE TWENTIETH CENTURY, VISITORS WILL FIND THAT THESE SAME IDEALS, GOALS AND OPPORTUNITIES STILL DRAW PEOPLE FROM THROUGHOUT THE WORLD TO OUR PROVINCE.

THE FINAL AREA IN THE ONTARIO PLACE EXHIBITION WILL TAKE VISITORS INTO THE PRESENT AND THE FUTURE.

THERE WILL BE NO END TO THE EXHIBITION AT ONTARIO PLACE. JUST AS ONTARIO'S HISTORY CONTINUES TO UNFOLD EACH YEAR, SO WILL THE ONTARIO PLACE EXHIBITION. IT WILL BE CONSTANTLY REVISED AND UPDATED.



The "haida" will become a part of Ontario Place in the spring. That graceful brigantine "Pathfinder", which you may have seen performing as a sailing school for Ontario youngsters, will make its home port at Ontario Place not far from a boatyard where visitors can watch a new brigantine being constructed.

ONTARIO PLACE COUNTDOWN:

200 DAYS UNTIL OPENING

TORONTO - - It's exactly 200 days to go until the opening of Ontario Place, the new provincial showcase in Lake Ontario, south of Exhibition Park. Opening date will be May 22, 1971.

To mark the countdown occasion, Prime Minister

John Robarts yesterday previewed the partially completed

pavilion and the man-made island site for more than 800 guests

and newsmen.

In the first speech delivered inside the Ontario

Place pavilion structure, Mr. Robarts called the project

"a new focal point for our province." It will be "a festive,

exciting and informative place; a place which demonstrates a new

attitude to our lakefronts; a place which offers a tremendous

variety of activities to meet the variety of interests held by

people from all across our province and beyond."

ONTARIO PLACE - - 2.

Although the 90=acre site is more mud than parkland at this stage, some signs of landscaping and tree-planting could be seen. On the new islands, the completed structures of the pavilion rising out of the water, and Cinesphere, the triodetic Dome film theatre, gave a spectacular idea of the final shape of Ontario Place.

The project was announced on March 11, 1969 and the first truckload of landfill moved onto the site within a few days. Now, 19 months later, landfill operations are about 95 percent completed with 2,116,016 cubic yards delivered in 336,612 truckloads. This has created about 40 acres of new islands, for Ontario Place.

A comparison with Montreal's Expo 67 site which was created by a landfilling operation: Expo used from 20-25 million cubic yards to create 400 acres of new land in the St. Lawrence. Thus, Ontario Place is about one-tenth of the size of the Expo land areas. The lagoons, and other enclosed water areas bring up the Ontario Place site to more than 90 acres.

ONTARIO PLACE - - 3.

The \$18 million Ontario Place project was an "opportunity to demonstrate what can be done when thoughtful planning and a concern for the quality of life are applied to lakefront development," Mr. Robarts said. He added that the provincial government project was designed to help complement the Canadian National Exhibition.

Other announcements made at this preview tour:

Recruiters are currently visiting the 17 university campuses in the province to choose the 200 hosts and hostesses for Ontario Place in its first season. As well, about 700 other students will be needed for other jobs at the project.

Four films are currently being made in various parts of the province for showing in Cinesphere. Their subjects will include northwestern Ontario, central-north Ontario, eastern Ontario and the waterways of Ontario.

Cinesphere will be the world's most advanced film theatre with a 60-by-80 foot screen, one of the world's largest, and a complex 24-track stero sound system.

The Ontario Place pavilion will have a five-part mixed-media exhibition in four of its five "pods" to trace the Ontario story from the time of earth's creation all the way to the challenges of the future.

The Forum, an outdoor amphitheatre, will feature concerts by the Toronto Symphony Orchestra next summer, folk music, rock, amateur talent and other cultural events.

The Ontario Place islands will have boutiques, restaurant and snack facilities, picnic areas, children's play areas and beaches.

Two ships, the World War II destroyer Haida and the brigantine Pathfinder will use Ontario Place as home port.

The marina has a capacity of 300 boats.
