

DETERMINED ROBBER HOLDS UP MERCHANT

**Secures Only \$30, Though
Manager Had \$300 in
His Pocket**

"SCOOPS" CASH REGISTER

Gripping a revolver in each hand, a robber entered the Dominion Store, 483 Church Street at 11 o'clock Saturday night, and keeping John Huey, manager of the store, and his wife standing against the wall, stole \$30 in cash from the register.

Mrs. Huey was alone in the store when the man entered. On walking over to the counter he drew a gun from his pocket and said: "Remain quiet." Mrs. Huey screamed, and her husband, who was in the rear of the store, rushed out. As he appeared the robber is said to have presented a second revolver and ordered Huey to stand still.

Putting one of the revolvers back in his pocket, he is reported to have walked behind the counter and opening the cash drawer scooped out the contents. No attempt was made by the hold-up man to search Mr. Huey, who had some \$300 in his pocket. After securing the money the robber walked out of the store and disappeared on Church Street. A good description of the hold-up man was given Detectives Devitt and McArthur.

GAMBLING IS CHARGED.
