

REV. DR. STUART BATES BURIED AT WOODSTOCK

Toronto Friends Attend Funeral of Well-Known Baptist Divine

Woodstock, Dec. 21.—The funeral of Rev. Dr. Stuart S. Bates, well-known Baptist divine, of Toronto, and a former well-known Woodstock man, was held Saturday morning. The remains were accompanied by a party of eight from Toronto, and the funeral cortege proceeded at once to the Baptist Cemetery, where services, impressive in their simplicity, were conducted by Rev. Joseph Janes of the First Baptist Church, this city, assisted by Rev. Dr. J. H. Farmer of McMaster University.

The pallbearers, who came from Toronto, were: Dr. Stuart Bates of Pasadena, Cal.; Dr. Edgar Bates, Toronto; Harold Bates, Toronto; Arthur Reed, Toronto; Rev. H. E. Stillwell, Toronto, and Rev. John McLaurin, a nephew of the deceased.

Those who accompanied the remains from Toronto were the three sons, who acted as pallbearers; Arthur Reed, Rev. H. E. Stillwell, Rev. Dr. Farmer, Rev. John McLaurin and Prof. Campbell of McMaster University.

Among the Woodstock friends of the deceased in attendance at the service were: F. H. Goble, Major Ralph Wilcock of Woodstock College, John Bain, J. W. Blow, Rev.
