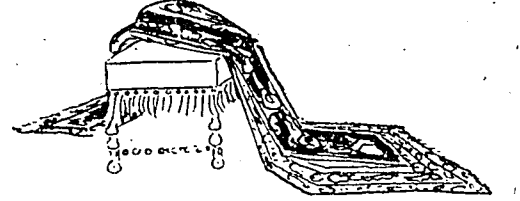

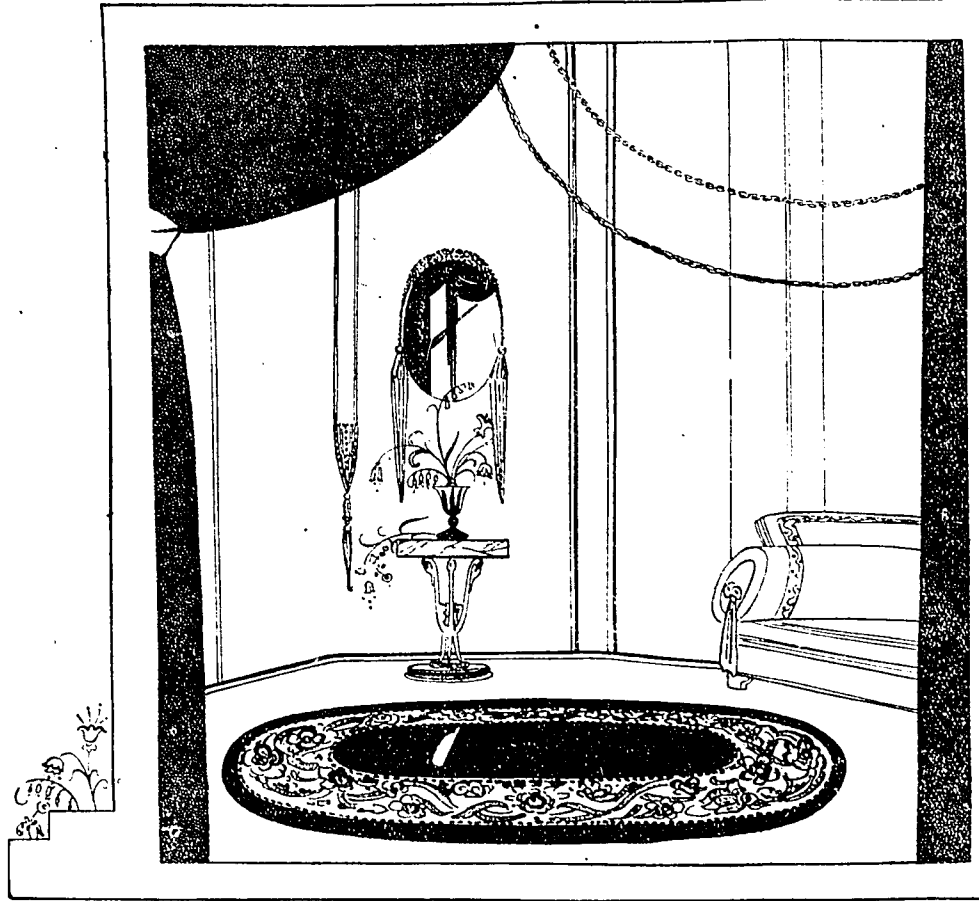

FINE HARMONY MARKS MEETING AUTO HURLS BOY INTO WINDSHIELD

Twelve-year-old Lad Carried 50 Yards Before Extricated

Special Dispatch to the Globe. Brampton, Sept. 24.—(Special.)—Lockie, 12-year-old son of William Algie, Brampton, met with a serious accident late last night, when a car going north struck the bicycle on which he was riding and hurled him backward through the windshield of the car.

The youth had been riding behind another car and turned out to the side when the car which struck him was but a short distance away. Dr. Bryden was immediately summoned, and the boy was carried to the hospital nearby.

The two occupants of the car, G. Hunter of Maple and a man who gave his name as John Marshall of Brampton, were before Police Magistrate Crawford this morning, but the case was remanded until the boy is able to give evidence.
