Forget the CN Tower, Toronto. The Aura condo is the city's newest landmark.








Cross section of existing and approved buildings fronting High Street






North Downtown Yonge Site and Area Specific Policy 382 (2016)





- 10 Wellesley St W (2017) = 64-storeys (appealed)

Sections and Features



500-per-cent property tax increase will change the face of Yonge St.: Keenan

The increase is based on the potential value of the land. For small business owners that means if a 40-storey condo is built next door, they are taxed as if they had a 40-storey condo.

"Highest and Best Use"

In high-growth areas, the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) assesses a commercial property's value according to what it could be, rather than what it is. **As a result, property values have been skyrocketing in Toronto, and with them, commercial property tax bills.**"



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

Creating a Chain Store Retail Strategy for Toronto - by Councillor Mike Layton, seconded by Councillor Kristyn Wong-Tam

City Council Decision

City Council on March 28 and 29, 2017, adopted the following:

1. City Council request the Chief Planner and Executive Director, City Planning, in consultation with the General Manager, Economic Development and Culture, to report to the Planning and Growth Management Committee in the fourth quarter of 2017 on an approach to a potential retail strategy that:

a. ensures new retail uses better address the goals and objectives of the Official Plan;

b. evaluates similar policies in other cities, including, but not limited to, the 2006 Formula Retail Strategy in San Francisco; and

c. promotes flexibility and incentivizes variation in both the size and type of new retail spaces on commercial main streets.
