

SAMUEL HOWARTH DEAD.

WELL-KNOWN YONGE STREET
DRUGGIST SUDDENLY EXPIRED.

Death Was Due to an Affection of the
Heart — The Deceased Was 54
Years of Age and Was Born in
Toronto.

At 8.30 last night Mr. Samuel Howarth, a well-known druggist, passed suddenly away at his residence, 83 Charles street, death being caused by heart trouble. The deceased conducted a drug store at 243 Yonge street, and was at business on Saturday night, but he complained several times of pains about the heart. Yesterday afternoon he contemplated going out, but again experienced one of the painful attacks, and the doctor was sent for. Mr. Howarth seemed to have improved when the doctor arrived and conversed in a jocular manner until the doctor left. Before leaving the physician left a prescription, and it was while this was being filled that Mr. Howarth suddenly expired.

The deceased was fifty-four years of age. He was born in Toronto and served his apprenticeship as a druggist with his father the late John Howarth. Upon his father's decease he assumed charge of the store at 243 Yonge street. He attended All Saints' Anglican Church. He leaves behind him, besides his widow, three sisters, Mrs. J. F. Peterkin, Sarah and Maria, and one brother, John.

The funeral will take place from the family residence on Tuesday at 2.30 o'clock to Mount Pleasant Cemetery. Service will be held at the home.
