Publishing Co. in New York, Mr. Adam returned Toronto in to 1884 and joined the staff of the Ontario Bank. Following the absorption of this of this bank by the Bank of Montreal in 1906. he served as manager of various branches in the city. In 1914

he was appointed manager of the Toronto head office, continuing until his retirement in 1932. He was also former chairman of the advisory board of the Royal Trust Co.

Mr. Adam had been a resident of Weston since 1912, when he acquired a farm and indulged in his hobby for gardening. His Weston home, known as The Elms, is noted for its lilacs and roses. He was a member of the Toronto Golf Club, the Toronto Hunt Club, the Canadian Club and an active worker at SI. Philips' Anglican Church, Weston.

Surviving are his widow, the former Nettle Rolph; a sister, Mrs. Ethel Dwight, New York; and a brother, Reginald Adam., Akron, Ohio. His only daughter, Madeline, was killed in a motor accident in 1917.
