

# SURGEON STRICKEN AT WHEEL OF CAR AFTER MAKING CALL

Dr. **Beverley Z. Milner** Had  
Been Prominent in City  
Hospitals

BORN IN STRATFORD

Stricken with a heart attack as he was coming from treating a patient on Jackes Avenue, Dr. **Beverley Z. Milner**, prominent Toronto surgeon, 15 Glencairn Avenue, was found dead, slumped over the steering wheel of his automobile, on Jackes Avenue last night.

Miss Nora Bayes, 24 Rosehill Avenue, was walking along Jackes Avenue about 9 o'clock when she noticed Dr. **Milner** slumped in his car. She notified the police and Detective-Sergeant Strohm, with Coroner Dr. J. Loudon, investigated. They found the man dead when they arrived. The ignition of his car was turned off.

Dr. **Milner** was well known in Toronto medical circles. He was born in Stratford 69 years ago, the son of Rev. Jonathan **Milner**, a Methodist clergyman of Toronto. Dr. **Milner** received his earlier education in Woodstock and Barrie high schools.

For many years he was associate head surgeon of the Hospital for Sick Children. He later became surgeon-in-chief, in charge of the outpatients department at the Toronto General Hospital. He served in that capacity for eight years.

At the time of his death Dr. **Milner** was Honorary Consulting Surgeon to the Hospital for Sick Children and a Fellow of the Academy of Medicine.

He is survived by his widow, Clara Maud Aitkin; a son, **Beverley**, of Toronto; and two daughters, Marjorie and Dorothy, at home. The funeral will be on Saturday from his late residence.
