

Eugene M. Blaise

Real estate broker in Toronto for more than 22 years, Eugene M. Blaise died yesterday at Sunnybrook Hospital. Born in Lanvellan, Brittany, Mr. Blaise came to Canada with his wife in 1908 and entered the construction business in Toronto. He served with the 169th Regiment overseas in the First World War, was wounded out and transferred to the Engineers. Returning to Canada in 1919, Mr. Blaise added real estate to his construction and building ventures. In latter years, he was interested solely in real estate. Mr. Blaise was a member of St. Mark's Anglican Church. He leaves two sons, Charles and Wilfred, both of Toronto.

Arthur E. Hankins

A salesman for A. A. Allans Company for more than 30 years until his retirement due to illness last November, Arthur Edwin Hankins, 61, died yesterday at Toronto General Hospital. Born in Montreal, Mr. Hankins served overseas with the 14th battery of the Canadian Army for five years. He remained in France until 1919, returning to Toronto to join A. A. Allans. He was a member of the Travellers' Association and an active member of North Parkdale United Church. Mr. Hankins was a keen woodworker, with a complete shop in the basement of his home, where he turned out furniture and other woodwork. He leaves his wife, Mary E. Thorpe Hankins, and a son Frank of Toronto.
